TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

The Trustees, who are also the management committee memebers of the association, submit their report and the financial statements of the Newstead Wood Parents' Association (PA) for the year ended 31st . July 2016.

The Trustees and committee members are elected at the AGM and serve on the committee until the next AGM when they can be re-elected or step-down. The General Committee leads the activities of the association. It ensures delivery of its objectives, upholds its values and sets its strategic direction. It meets at least three times a year and agendas with supporting papers are circulated to all Committee members a week before each meeting.

Members of the General Committee include Trustees, parent representatives, the Head of Newstead Wood School and the school representative for the PA.

The objectivesof the committee are:

- (i) to provide opportunities for close co-operation between parents, staff and pupils past and present.
- (ii) to raise funds for the provision of additional amenities and facilities as may be considered necessary and desirable.

A new constitution for the PA was voted in and adopted in March 2016 and approved by the Charity Commission.

Activities during the year:

The Social Committee volunteer to lead and organise the school social events. Over the past year, they have organised the years 7-9 Disco, Family Quiz night, and the International Cultural evening.

Around 15 parents helped the social committee members with the organisation of the disco which was attended by 105 pupils from both the neighbouring boys school St Olaves' and Newstead Wood. The PA made a sum total of £747 from ticket sales and sales of glow sticks and sweets.

The Family Quiz night in March was a fun event attended by more than 100 people (adults and children) raising £994. This amount was further increased by match funding by a parent Milind Chaudhari whose employer, Barclays matched the ticket sales takings with an amount of £750 making a total of £1744. We would like to thank Mr Chaudhari for pledging his match-funding to the PA.

Our new event for this year, the International Cultural evening was organised by Tetty Baxter in conjunction with the sixth form student reps. The students put together an evening of entertaining performances from various regions and cultures from all over the world. A superb selection of food was offered by parents ranging from British scones to Jamaican and Ghanaian rice, Mexican tacos to Indian samosas. The students had planned to support two charities but chose to support just the charity Deptford Reach with their share of the money raised (£381) and the PA committee decided to donate the PA share of the money to the same charity. The PA hopes to continue this successful and fun event every year with the aid of the students.

We would like to thank the Social Committee members (Alisa Igoe, Julita Pearson, Irina Pearson, Parul Agrawal, Elaine Turnbull, Tetty Baxter, Peter Benson) for their commitment and efforts in organising these events and raising much needed funds for the school.

The Nearly New Uniform Sale has grown to be a steady fundraiser providing parents with some good quality second hand uniforms for the students. Elaine Turnbull has been running this event over the last year at least once a term with help from parent volunteers. The PA has made £1312 over the year through this and the Trustees would like to thank Elaine and other parent volunteers for their effort in

keeping this going.

The money raised from the click through website Easyfundraising brought in an additional £953 over this year towards our fundraising total.

The PA's main source of funds has always been the generous donations of parents through regular standing orders or one-off doantions each year. This amount has been declining with the total this year of £33,227 versus last year's total of £39,353. Almost all of this money is used to support the school with extra amenities as requested by them, and agreed by all attending committee members at the meetings over the year. Following the school's request to no longer ask for new donations from parents joining from September 2016 the PA may not be able to meet these regular requests going forward as the incoming funds will have reduced significantly.

The PA has regularly funded the minibus lease (£15,834) and annual maintenance (£2,500), funding for library books (£6000), the school hardship fund (£10,000) and various other items over the last few years and it has been the same this year. In addition the PA has also funded the re-modelling and refurbishment of the DT kitchen with new units and appliances (£9,703), the new projector (£6,904) for the main school hall and various other smaller items.

We would like to thank all parents and carers for their continued support of the PA whether through the donations we receive, or the volunteers who give their time at the various social events, or the parents who come to support us at all our events through their attendance. The school and the children benefit immensley regardless of whether you give time, money or your presence and the PA is thankful to have this support during this year and in the future.

The past year has seen a decrease in parental donations from £39,353 to £33,227 as well as a decrease in the overall income of the Association from £50,866 to £47,620.

The Association has spent £62,467 on the needs of the school.

At the end of July 2016 the association had assets of £21,686 (2015: £37,482)

1 Accounting Policies

1.1 Basis of preparation
