

Shakespeare Adaptation Could Inspire Youth



A 16-year-old student named Harvey Jones from Coventry Academy is helping to produce a modern version of Shakespeare's *Romeo and Juliet* that will combine classic poetry with rap and R&B music. The show, which will be performed at the Belgrade Theatre, is designed to appeal to people across different generations who enjoy spoken word poetry. Harvey, who also worked on the music and direction for the production, believes that the blend of classic and modern styles will make the story more relatable. The themes of love and family conflict in *Romeo and Juliet* are universal and are still relevant today. The performance will run from the 21st of February to the 8th of March, and is a collaboration with

nearest participating retailer <u>here</u>. Tokens are valid until Sunday 23rd of March.


Here's a summary of the £1 World Book Day exclusive books available this year that might be of interest to Y7 and up:


