# CONNECTING CURRICULUM TO CAREERS



A lawyer is a general term referring to anyone who is qualified to give legal advice as a licensed legal practitioner. This includes solicitors and barristers.

A solicitor is a confidential adviser that has direct contact with clients. Expertise & people skills are required to provide legal guidance & assistance. Specialisations include civil litigation, criminal justice, employment, human rights, immigration, property or tax.

Barristers provide specialist legal advice, hold conferences with clients & represent them in court, examine witnesses, as well as negotiating settlements.

How do I get legal work experience? Organise informal work experience with high street legal firms, shadowing a solicitor or carrying out general office duties, also look at the online platform Forage, alternatively, why not approach Citizens Advice?

What qualifications do I need for university? Entry requirements for a law degree is generally ABB.

Which are the best law schools in the UK (according to the Times World University Rankings by subject 2024) University of Cambridge \* University of Oxford \* University College London (UCL) \* University of Edinburgh \* London School of Economics and Political Science \* King's College London.

What qualifications do I need to get a job? You will need a degree (from university or via an apprenticeship) but the degree doesn't need to be a law degree. For those with a non law degree, a law conversion course will need to be completed. Finally you will need specific law qualifications.

What skills are required to work in this industry? Excellent communication skills, a dedication to a career in law, good negotiating and problem solving skills, accuracy and attention to detail, numeracy and IT skills, stamina, flexibility, self confidence, resilience and good time management.
